Supplementary School

This is an after school facility for children aged 5-16 to learn Qur'anic recitation with Tajwid and translation, Arabic Language and other Islamic disciplines.

This supplementary school operates 5 hours a week Monday to Thursday (4 days p/w) in line with the academic year.

Primary Years Year 1-2 (ages 5-6)

Strong emphasis on reading the Qur'an with correct pronunciation.

Basic Islamic Concepts and terminology; instilling simple sense of Muslim identity by exploring key concepts.

Memorising the prayer (salah) and other essential Duas.

A more visual approach adopted with text but at a minimum level. This makes the lessons more interactive and engaging for students.

Child friendly content

Primary Years Year 3-6 (ages 7-11)

Students' progress to reading the Qur'an with application of Tajwid rules.

Islamic Studies is introduced through an extensive syllabus with interactive coloured textbooks, workbooks covering a range of topics:

- Aqidah
- Fiqh
- Sirah
- History
- Manners
- Personal Development



Secondary Years Years 7-9 (ages 11-13)

Students complete full Qur'an recitation with application of all the Tajwid rules.

We introduce learners to syllabus for Schools Islamic Studies. This covers:

Importance of Qur'an, Detailed Sirah Studies, History, Hadith Development, Selection of Tafsir, Early Islamic History, Articles of Faith, Pillars of Islam, and Contemporary Issues.

Regular assessments as well as end of year exams.

Lessons delivered through presentations on smart screens.

Secondary Years Years 10-11 (ages 14-16)

Students leave the 4 day supplementary school and attend 1 weekly class of 2 hours. This includes:

Completion of syllabus Islamic Studies Book 4 & 5.

At the end of the academic year, students will sit their fully accredited GCSE exam in Islamic Studies.

Seminars and workshops are also delivered on Contemporary issues covering the following topics:

Relationships, Marriage, Abortion, Interest, Drugs, Atheism, Alcohol, Science and Qur'an as well as other topics.

A forum to ask questions and have open discussions.

Gateway to Islamic Studies Programme:

After completing the primary years, parents can enrol their children on to the GIS programme, which covers the Arabic Language and introduces students to the traditional Islamic Sciences at a foundational level.

This is taught over 2 sessions a week of 5 hours.

This course covers:

- Skills of Arabic Learning: Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening
- Tafsir, Aqidah, Fiqh, Hadith, Sirah, Shama'il, Islamic History and Tajwid
- Tarbiyah

Explanatory notes, exercises, discussion points and problem solving activities are used to engage students with the texts, making learning fun, interactive and relevant to their lives.
